- Planning to collect cans and non-perishable goods until the end of March. Cindi asked Ed
 for the height of the steeple so they could have a goal of meeting that. She also asked for
 the dimensions of the building length and width for future plans.

PASTOR

- She expressed thanks for the great response to the signup sheets.. One will be added for Sunday morning greeters.
- Flower Ministry was discussed. Perilene Twyman has been named as the point person. Cindi Barkley will get prices for Easter plants.
- Pastor Kelly explained a new program she's heard that other churches are considering.
 called "Flowers to Flours". Donors' names would still be listed in the bulletin, but instead of a plant, the money would be donated to help feed the hungry. There would still be a few plants on the altar on Easter morning. No action was taken.
- Something to think about. Suggestions were charging double and going ½ and ½ or adding an extra amount to the price to be donated as we do for Food Forward.
- Kris Collins will no longer do the gardens so this was discussed. Some ideas were to form a garden group and organize what needs to take place. Carolyn suggested that maybe the time has come to stop the annual planting --bulbs will bloom in the spring, then the azaleas blossom. In the fall the mums bloom. So if the gardens are mulched and the bushes are trimmed it will still look nice. Summers are hot now almost every day, the plants require more water and get burned, plus the cost will be much higher this year, Henry Chretien has offered to keep the bushes trimmed.
- Everyone received a copy of the bulletin to be used for The Great 50 Days while Pastor Kelly is on sabbatical. Things are falling into place.
- Jim Fennell read the Pastoral Relations paragraph to be included with the call agreement regarding sabbaticals. He will collect the necessary signatures on Sunday.
- The next meeting will be on Apr. 19th and Pastor Kelly will be gone then. Could move the
 meeting to Tues. the 12th during Holy Week. Pastor will give ZOOM information before she
 goes.
- Music was discussed and it can be run by Ellen for approval during the 50 days, etc.
- Jim Koepfler asked for approval for our annual Easter picture. We've missed 2 years due to the pandemic.
- Carolyn suggested that we do something to thank Katerina Trieb for her service to the church during these past years. She'll be going to college in the fall. Either in June or at the April yard sale. Ed will check this out and let us know.

- Jim Koepfler proposed that we take \$3,000 from the Building Fund to pay on the balance that we owe for the schoolhouse work. Jim Brinson cautioned that we need to watch our checkbook balance and not let it get too low. All approved and Jim will write the check.
- Pastor Kelly will speak to Dan about the installation of railings leading up to the pulpit. They will be on one side of the stairways only and assist people going up and down.
- As there was no further business and no deletions needed to be made, Deanne asked Pastor Kelly to give a closing prayer and we adjourned.
